"An Out of Season Transition"

Fall 2020

Crisis has a way of revealing the condition of a person's faith. The difficulties of 2020 have affected us all. As it pertains to the ministry, we had a plan for 2020 concerning Living Stone and it was a good one. I (Jason) would work with Pastor Dan Ebbens on taking over inside the prison this summer, and then slowly fade out of the day to day ministry within the fence of the Mike Durfee State Prison. At that time, Ruth and I would begin the launch of the church on the streets of Sioux Falls for former inmates, that we've been calling "Freedom's Gate". We made our plans known to those who attended our March banquet, but the following day I was held out of entering the prison because of COVID concerns and did not enter the gates again until July. For 4 months I was unable to see the men of Living Stone!

Let me be vulnerable here, I had my "dark night of the soul" moment when the reality of how the virus was messing with progress hit. I started to feel hopeless and helpless as if the pandemic would swallow the vision that God had set before us. Thankfully, I took some time to walk in a wooded area near my home, and let God talk me down off the ledge I seemed to be teetering on. It was in that season, that I heard God say in the stillness of my own heart, you are a preacher, preach! I got the message, it was time for me to look at what I could do instead of

continuing to grieve the plans we'd made, that were not going to work the way we'd hoped.

I've been reminded in all of this of something the Apostle Paul wrote to his friend, the young pastor Timothy. He said; "I charge you in the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and by his appearing and his kingdom: preach the word; be ready in season and out of season; reprove, rebuke, and exhort, with complete patience and teaching." (2 Timothy 4:1–2 ESV) In other words, we might feel like we are out of season, but God's Word and the Gospel message within it, are always in season.

With that that thought in mind, we have pressed forward into the vision for Living Stone's future with an altered timeline. Starting in the middle of October, Pastor Dan has begun as lead pastor of Living Stone and we have started working with former inmates in Sioux Falls. COVID didn't swallow the vision, it just made us focus all the more on the One who cast the vision in the first place. You see, crisis doesn't kill God's work in this world, it enforces the need for it. We've felt the discouragement that the events of 2020 have brought about, but to quote a song by the group Selah, "in Jesus name we press on" because preaching the Word is always in season.
